In this new series, some of today's most popular celebrity chefs and food experts share personal insights and engage in lighthearted conversations as they screen – and delight in – some of Julia Child's most beloved episodes. Featured celebrities include Martha Stewart, Jacques Pépin, Vivian Howard, Marcus Samuelsson, José Andrés, Eric Ripert and Rick Bayless.

Masterpiece: World on Fire

The Gene: An Intimate History

This two-part series vividly brings to life the story of today's revolution in medical science through tales of patients and doctors at the forefront of the search for genetic treatments. Presented by Ken Burns, the series also explores the compelling history of the discoveries that made modern treatments possible – and considers the ethical challenges raised by the ability to edit DNA with precision.

Independent Lens: Bedlam MON Apr 13 | 10p

Haunted by the death of a mentally ill sister, psychiatrist Ken Rosenberg takes on the role of filmmaker to examine a national health crisis. *Bedlam* follows the poignant stories of people grappling with schizophrenia, bipolar disorder and other chronic psychiatric conditions. Impossible to mask when untreated, their symptoms shove them into the path of police officers, ER doctors and nurses, lawyers and prison guards. Rosenberg takes us inside Los Angeles County's overwhelmed psych ER, a nearby jail warehousing thousands of psychiatric patients, and the homes – and homeless encampments – of people suffering from severe mental illness.

Cuba is the largest island in the Caribbean, and onefifth of its territory is protected habitat for spectacular wildlife found nowhere else on the planet. Explore how surprising and resilient rabbits and hares can be as they face the incredible challenges in the wild, from habitat loss to climate change.

Broken Places MON Apr 6 | 10p

Why are some children permanently damaged by early adversity while others are able to thrive? To answer this question, filmmaker Roger Weisberg dug into his extensive film archive to update some of the stories of the abused and neglected children he filmed decades ago. Viewers are given a unique time-lapse perspective on how the trauma that these children experienced shaped their lives as adults. The film interweaves these narratives with commentary from experts in neurobiology and child development to illuminate the impact of childhood adversity as well as the factors that can foster resilience.


