

The truth is much more nuanced and complicated, and the challenges that the American people confronted raise questions that remain essential to American society today.

"Faya Dayi," airing September 4, is a hypnotic immersion in the world of Harar, Ethiopia, a place where one commodity – khat, a euphoria-inducing plant – holds sway over the rituals and rhythms of everyday life. "Faya Dayi" captures intimate moments in the lives of everyone from the harvesters of the crop to people lost in its narcotic haze to a desperate but determined younger generation searching for an escape from political strife.

Then, on September 11, don't miss "Love & Stuff." Seven months after helping her terminally ill mother die in in-home hospice, filmmaker Judith Helfand becomes a "new old" single mother at 50. Overnight, she's pushed to deal with her "stuff:" 63 boxes of her parents' heirlooms overwhelming her office-turned-future baby's room.

Indigenous Creatives spotlights artists and culture bearers from Turtle Island and Pasifika, across diverse creative disciplines. "Black Lucy and The Bard," airing September 16, reframes the mysterious love life of literary legend William Shakespeare through the perspective of the illustrious "Dark Lady" for whom many of his famed sonnets were written. Based on the book by Nashville poet Caroline Randall Williams, this contemporary Nashville Ballet production explores themes of love, otherness, equality and beauty.

Then, on September 23, "Intimate Apparel" tells the story of Esther, an unmarried and increasingly lonely African American woman in 1905, who makes her living sewing beautiful corsets and ladies' undergarments. Although she shares a warm affection with the Orthodox Jewish man who sells her fabrics, any possibility of a romantic relationship between them is taboo.
